In 2014 Governor John Hickenlopper appointed Gerry to the Regional Air Quality Commission and reappointed him a second term 2016-2019.

Gerry brings 40 years of business experience building successful enterprises. Most recently, he provided business development and management services to science and technology companies as well as drove for Uber.

Gerry has degrees in economics and geography (BS Towson State University), resource economics (MA Johns Hopkins University), and a Ph.D. in wildlife biology from Colorado State University.
